Chinoiserie style

Chinese art became very fashionable in interiors in the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries. Design themes such as dragons and lotus flowers were used in wood carvings, paper walls, furniture, textile and porcelain.

Art Nouveau

Art Nouveau distinguished for its elongated forms and pastel colours. The rooms were designed around grid patterns, dominated by slightly curving verticals and ending in stylized petal shapes, offset by occasional shallow curves. These patterns were also expressed in furniture, in surfaces decorations, in textile and in metal fittings. Windows and doors were unframed and recessed into walls to emphasise the room's solidity and mass.

The oriental style

The oriental style is simple; the colours used are those of nature. Furniture is hand crafted. Accessories are predominantly of utensil. Fabrics are dyed in natural way and reflect the colours of earth and vegetation. For western adaptation of this design, use white and cream natural fabrics, with touches of black and scarlet, and green plants. Add beautiful screens, floor cushions and low tables with porcelain and rich red and black lacquer ware.
